



# State Court Administrative Office 2018 Problem-Solving Courts Training Calendar

## **1/03/2018 Federal SCAO Grant Reporting Requirements (Hall of Justice, Lansing)**

This training is intended for anyone involved in grant reporting for the Byrne Justice Assistance Grant (Byrne) and/or Office of Highway Safety Planning (OHSP) grants. This training will provide an overview of grant reporting requirements for courts receiving federal grant funding through the State Court Administrative Office.

## **1/18/2018 Juvenile Mental Health Court Forum (Hall of Justice, Lansing)**

This forum is intended for all juvenile mental health court team members. Topics for discussion, in small and large groups, will focus on common issues that impact participants and operations of juvenile mental health court programs.

## **4/03/2018 Certification Process Training (Hall of Justice, Lansing)**

This training is intended for the coordinators/leaders of mental health court and veterans treatment court programs. This training will provide a comprehensive overview of the certification process for these program types. Topics will include integration of best practices, the certification application, available training and technical assistance, and the SCAO site visit process.

## **4/12/2018 DCCMIS Training (Hall of Justice, Lansing)**

DCCMIS Training is designed for anyone who enters data for a drug, sobriety, hybrid, family dependency, juvenile, veterans treatment court, or mental health court – from the initial screening process to discharge from the program. Additionally, the training includes an administration component, so courts can learn how to best use DCCMIS for each member of the team. The class also covers some short cuts in DCCMIS, including using bulk tasks and available reports.

## **4/24/2018 WebGrants Training (Hall of Justice, Lansing)**

This training is intended for anyone who is new to the WebGrants system, particularly team members in a veterans treatment or mental health court that does not receive grant funding. This training will introduce attendees to WebGrants, teach them how to use it, and demonstrate a step-by-step approach to operating the WebGrants system.

## **5/09/2018 Applying Standards and Best Practices to Promote Effective Outcomes (Hall of Justice, Lansing)**

This training is intended for team members from adult drug court programs (drug, sobriety, hybrid, and family dependency programs), adult mental health court programs, and veterans treatment court programs. It will focus on matching risk and needs to services and monitoring; incorporating therapeutic sanctions and incentives; team communication and cohesion; implementing proper drug testing practices; and applying a therapeutic approach using therapist input. At minimum, attendees must include the judge, a treatment provider, and at least two additional team members.

## **5/24/2018 Applying Standards and Best Practices to Promote Effective Outcomes (Bay College, Escanaba, Michigan)**

This training is intended for team members from adult drug court programs (drug, sobriety, hybrid, and family dependency programs), adult mental health court programs, and veterans treatment court programs. It will focus on matching risk and needs to services and monitoring; incorporating therapeutic sanctions and incentives; team communication and cohesion; implementing proper drug testing practices; and applying a therapeutic approach using therapist input. At a minimum, attendees must include the judge, a treatment provider, and at least two additional team members.

## **6/01/2018 DCAS Basic Training (Hall of Justice, Lansing)**

This training is for new users and those needing a refresher. Attendees will learn how to navigate the system, run simple statistics and interpret the output, build study groups, and use data to measure program performance. Attendees should have had a prior DCCMIS training.

## **6/13/2018 DCAS Basic Training (Gaylord, Michigan)-Cancelled**

This training is for new users and those needing a refresher. Attendees will learn how to navigate the system, run simple statistics and interpret the output, build study groups, and use data to measure program performance. Attendees should have had a prior DCCMIS training.

## **6/27/2018 SSSPP Training (Hall of Justice, Lansing)**

This training is designed for all Swift and Sure Sanctions Probation Program team members. Training sessions will focus on topics relevant to the operations of a Swift and Sure court.

### **7/10/2018 Drug Court Networking Forums (Hall of Justice, Lansing)**

The Drug Court Networking Forum is an event open to anyone involved with a drug, sobriety, hybrid, family dependency, or juvenile court in Michigan. Attendees are given the opportunity to network and share ideas, and to discuss topics in treatment courts. The format will include small and large group discussion.

### **8/01/2018 DCCMIS Training (Hall of Justice, Lansing)**

DCCMIS Training is designed for anyone who enters data for a drug, sobriety, hybrid, family dependency, juvenile, veterans treatment court, or mental health court – from the initial screening process to discharge from the program. Additionally, the training includes an administration component, so courts can learn how to best use DCCMIS for each member of the team. The class also covers some short cuts in DCCMIS, including using bulk tasks and available reports.

### **8/09/2018 Juvenile Mental Health Court Topic Training (Hall of Justice, Lansing)**

This training is designed specifically for all juvenile mental health court team members. Training sessions will focus on topics pertinent to the operations of juvenile mental health courts and participant needs.

### **9/12/2018 DCAS Basic Training (Hall of Justice, Lansing)**

This training is for new users and those needing a refresher. Attendees will learn how to navigate the system, run simple statistics and interpret the output, build study groups, and use data to measure program performance. Attendees should have had a prior DCCMIS training.

### **9/26/2018 Judicial Role and Leadership (Hall of Justice, Lansing)**

Research indicates that the role of the judge is a key element in the success of drug treatment courts. This training will address the roles and responsibilities of the problem-solving court judge — leadership of the PSC team and in the community, and the importance of interaction with the participant. The training will cover important topics such as confidentiality and due process. New research and recent case law makes this training essential for both new and experienced PSC judges.

### **10/02/2018 DCCMIS User Conference (Hall of Justice, Lansing)**

The DCCMIS user conference is open to anyone who enters information into DCCMIS, or uses DCCMIS to analyze data for their program. Attendees are given the opportunity to network and share ideas, and to discuss hot topics for DCCMIS. The training will focus on what is new in the DCCMIS system, tips and tricks to using the program, and how to use DCCMIS data to speak to commissioners or other funding units.

### **10/23/2018 Fundamentals of Problem-Solving Courts (Hall of Justice, Lansing)**

This training is required for all programs that received a planning grant of the current fiscal year through the SCAO and open to new team members, or teams needing refresher training. The training will focus on the basic fundamentals for each program type (drug, sobriety, hybrid, family dependency, juvenile, veterans treatment court, and mental health court). Discussion will be in large group and small breakout sessions.

### **11/06/2018 Process and Outcomes Evaluation Training (Hall of Justice, Lansing)**

This training will cover performance measures for drug, veterans treatment, and mental health courts; it will also explain the differences between process and outcome evaluations, and describe how data applies to each type of evaluation. Attendees must be knowledgeable about the Drug Court Analytic System (DCAS) database and its variables; however, this is NOT a DCAS training. Users of DCAS who are responsible for compiling data about their program for their team and/or community will benefit the most.

### **11/29/2018 Adult Mental Health Court Networking Forum (Hall of Justice, Lansing)**

The Mental Health Court Networking Forum is open to all adult mental health court team members. Topics for discussion, in large and small groups, will focus on common issues that impact participants and operations of adult mental health courts. This is a great opportunity to network, share ideas, and problem-solve among peers.

### **12/4/2018 DCCMIS Training (Hall of Justice, Lansing)**

DCCMIS Training is primarily designed for anyone who enters data for a drug, sobriety, hybrid, family dependency, juvenile, veterans treatment court, or mental health court. Swift and Sure team members who enter data might also benefit from this training – from the initial screening process to discharge from the program. Additionally, the training includes an administration component, so courts can learn how to best use DCCMIS for each member of the team. The class also covers some short cuts in DCCMIS, including using bulk tasks and available reports.
